Chapter 1 of my book titled *A Revival of the Scriptures* begins with these words:



Chapter 2

The Anatomy of a Miracle

What are Miracles?

The standard definition of a miracle is, *an event* that is inexplicable by the laws of nature and so is held to be supernatural in origin. Miracles look different in the eyes of God than they do in human eyes.

To human beings

Human beings and other earthly creatures are physical and dwell in the natural world. The natural world is quite limited. We are subject to time and space (or distance). The spirit world is just the opposite. God is spirit, His angels are spirits, and so is Satan and his minions. The operations of the spirit world are far surpassingly sophisticated than the physical world. Remember God is spirit and He created the physical world, meaning the spiritual world existed before the physical one, is responsible for it, and is

consequently far superior and more real than it. How ironic that the world that originated our own and is more real than it seems so unreal and as a consequence naturalist are out and out to prove that there is nothing to it. Many things that are impossible in the physical world are possible in the spiritual world. When beings of the spirit world act in and upon the physical world as they would in the spirit world, whatever they do appears wondrous to physical eyes because their actions defy the limitations of time and space which our eyes subject to. That is why even demons can perform supposed miracles. It's because what is natural to the spirit world is supernatural when disclosed to the physical world. However, miracles are more than just spirit beings passively acting in defiance of the natural order, they are also a result of exertion of spiritual power. This is where now we come to differentiate between God's power and the devil's power, the greater power can go exceedingly abundantly and infinitely further than the lesser power. That means Satan can do miracles with his power, but he, being a creature can only do so much, and even the power he uses originally came from the Creator. But imagine what the Creator with unlimited power can do. When Moses the servant of the Lord threw down his rod and it turned into a serpent in front of Pharaoh. Lo and behold the servants of the devil (Pharaoh's magicians) could perform the same miracle. Today's false prophets are weak compared to the magicians of Ancient Egypt, I'm not yet impressed. Satan's miracles are quite limited because they are dependent on God's existence and sustenance of the universe to happen, and on the limitation of his overall power as a mere created being. But to show His superseding power God caused the snake-rod of Moses to devour all the snakes of the servants of the devil. God went further to perform through Moses such astounding miracles against Egypt that the men working with the limited power of the devil confessed to their master Pharaoh that. "This is the finger of God" (Exodus 8:19). Now God knows everything that Satan is doing but Satan knows little of what God is doing. This is seen in the cases of Joseph and Daniel. The king of Egypt had a dream and none of the magicians or wise men of Egypt could decipher its mystery,

but Joseph came and did it as easy as a-b-c. Daniel did the same thing with Belshazzar king of Babylon after the hand from God wrote MENE MENE TEKEL - UPHARSIN. One other thing about the spir<mark>it world of the dark side is</mark> that God, being sovereign, can easily limit their work. This can be seen in the matter of Job Satan could only afflict Job at God's permission and to the extend allowed by God. In the matter of Elijah, Satan can surely make fire fall from the sky (Revelation 13:13), he could have done that for the prophets of Baal, and perhaps he wanted to, but it depended on whether the Lord would permit it or not. I mean the Lord permitted the magicians of Egypt to perform their wonders, didn't He?

Miracles to God

Whereas a miracle is cause of wonder to us, to God miracles are a triviality. God knows no miracles, to Him they are as easy as simply breathing, if I could put it that way. Does it not say in the Bible that nothing is too hard for God? Why would anything be hard for the Being who called the universe into existence ex nihilo? Furthermore, He sustains every single thing in existence through Jesus Christ His Word. When you say, "wooow it's a miracle," God says 'yawn,' it's normal.' He only looks at miracles as such for the accommodation of poor pathetic man. What is man that thou art mindful of him oh Lord?

Types of miracles

- Creative miracles Creation ex-nihilo is itself a miracle. God is able to create anything from nothing. No one else but Him can do anything like this. If you ever see Satan doing anything like this just know it is an illusion, it is not real. The Lord Jesus multiplied food and turned water into wine. These were creative miracles.
- Healing miracles God can remove disease and take what's wrong and make it right in an instant.
- Signs and wonders These are displays of power that cover creative miracles, healings, and other displays of supernatural power apart from healings

and creative miracles. When the Lord Jesus walked on water, that was a wonder. When He rebuked the storm and it immediately obeyed Him, that was a sign of great faith and a wonder.

All in all these terms (miracles, signs, and wonders) are generally interchangeable and mean more or less the same thing.

The purpose of miracles

God does miracles to help people and draw them to Himself for salvation and reverence. He did them to deliver His people out of Egypt and to magnify His holy name that it might be feared. He has to be feared for He is holy and man can get dangerously be irreverent and that tendency has to be put in check.

Miracles can at times serve as a sign that someone is truly sent from God. Moses had to perform the sign of turning the rod into a snake. The Lord Jesus turned water into wine to establish Himself in the hearts of His disciples. The Holy Spirit did miracles in the book of Acts to confirm that Jesus Christ had risen from the dead.

The Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Jesus Christ, glorifies Jesus, false prophets operating by another spirit glorify themselves.

How to test the or<mark>igin of a mirac</mark>le


Check with the Lord - Nothing is hidden from the fiery eyes of Jesus, ask Him if what you are seeing is from Him.

Check for the purpose - All miracles in the Bible were performed for a purpose. God did wonders in Egypt in order to deliver the Israelites from slavery and confirm Moses. Christ changed water into wine for a purpose. Miracles performed for a sideshow are not of Christ; like with the so-called prophet from Malawi who in a church service showed people a video of himself walking on air for the purpose of self-exaltation. Miracles performed by the Holy Spirit will point people to Jesus Christ.

Check the message - What is the preacher's message? Does it comfort people in sin or does it

call them out of it? A preacher who comforts people in sin is false even if he is using God's true power. In this days of many false prophets, many are not even using the Lord's power but are direct employees of Satan.

Check with the Bible - Anything that is not in line with the Bible is to be rejected.



Chapter 3

All Things are Possible

The God of the Bi<mark>ble is still the</mark> same

The God of the Bible hasn't changed. He can still do the same things we read in the Bible. God doesn't change because He is the ultimate Being. He doesn't need any change whatsoever. He doesn't always work the same way but as long as something is recorded in the Bible, it can still happen the same way, why not? If you are bound by alcohol, Jesus can turn the beer in your system into water, and He can remove those addictions and put in your soul a hunger and thirst after righteousness. Google the story of Mel Trotter and read of the grace of God. Furthermore, I myself was addicted to something for many years but continued to believe, pray and fast. I woke up one day and the addiction was 'gone with the wind.' That's the power of the Holy Spirit. These things are nothing to God.

If you want your loved ones to be saved, know that the God who answered the fervent prayers of Elijah and Hannah still answers prayer.

If you are crippled, the same Jesus who healed blind Bartimaeus, who healed the man with the withered hand, who healed the lame and cleansed lepers can command you to get up, carry your bed and walk, only believe. I know of a preacher who was preaching on the rod of Moses in his tent, he called forward someone walking with crutches, took one crutch and declared that if what God did with the rod of Moses was true He should still do it again, he threw the crutch down and it turned into a snake, people were on top of chairs in the tent but the power of the Lord descended and healed the sick with great demonstrations. Cessationists can be gone. The preacher's name is P.V Ndlhebende.

If you need financial help, let me tell you that the same Jesus who produced money to pay tax from the mouth of a fish is well able to provide for you. He multiplied food, it is a triviality for Him. He provides for me everyday. Stop being afraid, He is not a respector of persons, He cares for you, only believe.




